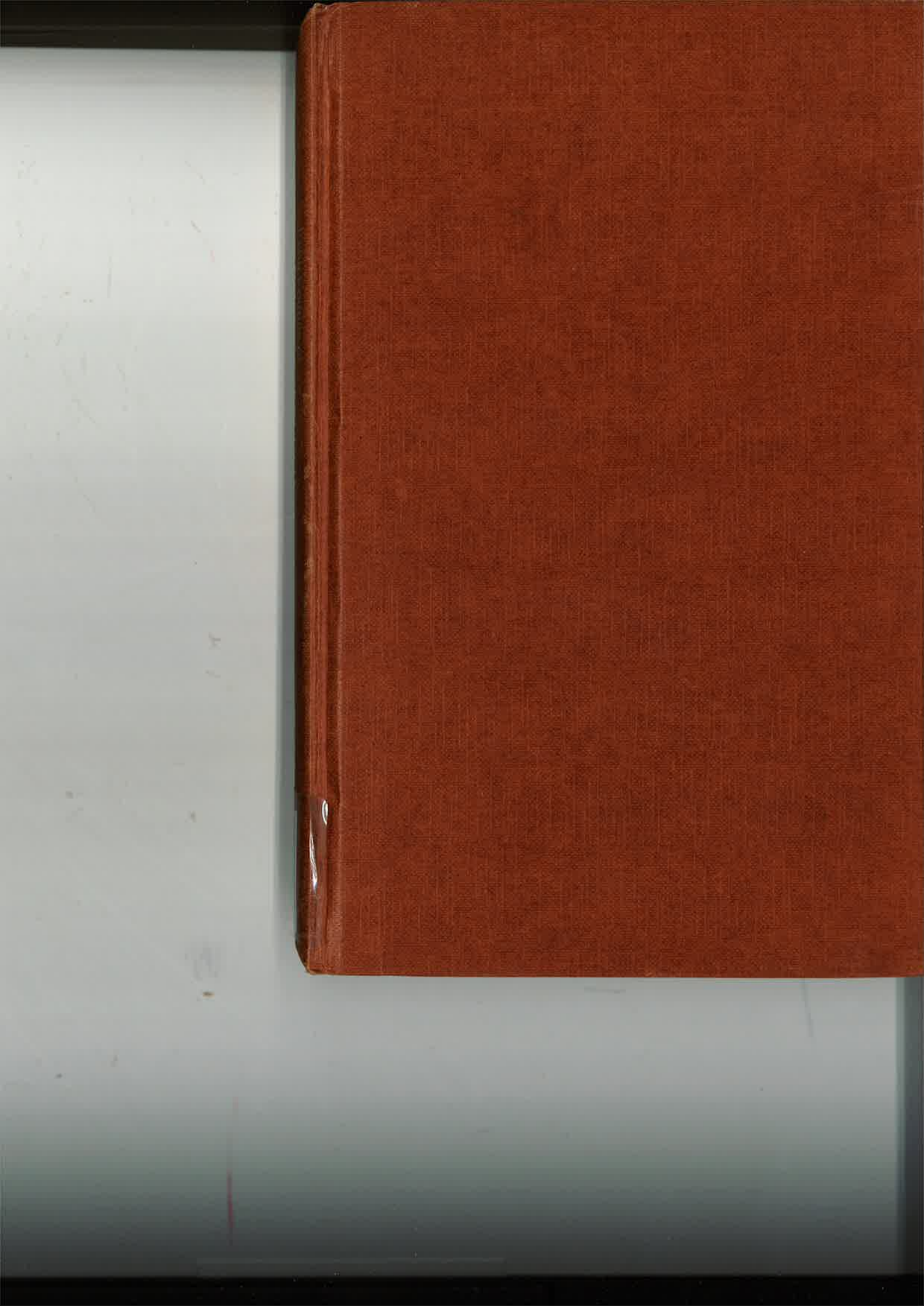




The Politics of Industrial Relations

COLIN CROUCH was born in 1944 and educated at the London School of Economics and Political Science and at Nuffield College, Oxford. He is now a lecturer in sociology at LSE. He is the author of *The Student Revolt* (1970), *Class Conflict and the Industrial Relations Crisis* (1977) and of articles and Fabian Society pamphlets in the fields of social stratification, industrial relations and social policy, and editor (with L. N. Lindberg and others) of *Stress and Contradiction in Modern Capitalism* (1975), of *British Political Sociology Yearbook*, Volume III: *Participation in Politics* (1977) and (with A. Pizzorno) of *The Resurgence of Class Conflict in Western Europe since 1968*, two volumes (1978). He is a former chairman of the Fabian Society.
